



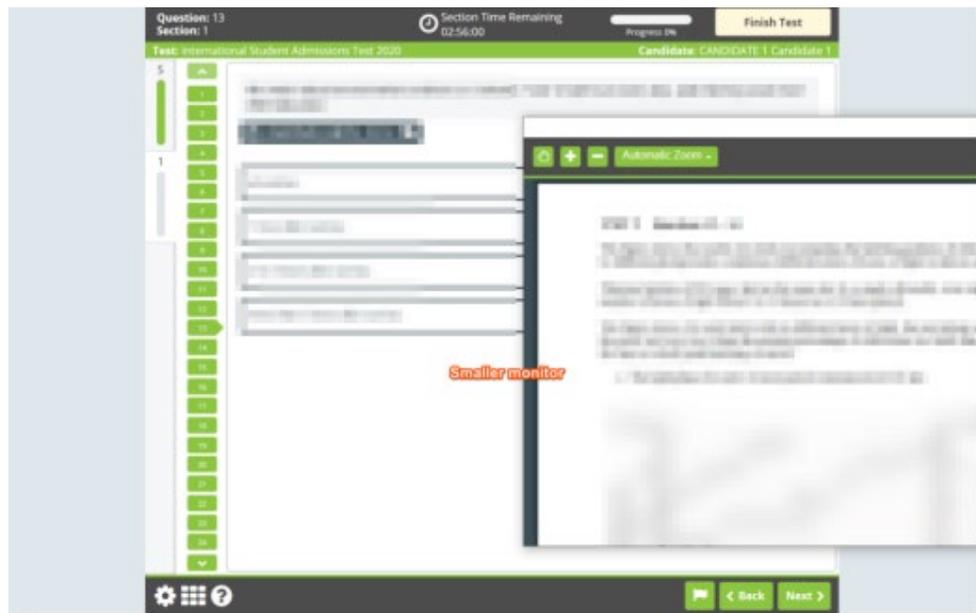
### Optimal Viewing on Exam Day | Side-by-side

When set at 1920 x 1080 resolution, the height and width of the computer display will present all exam content for the best viewing possible. Below, the PDF case is on the left and the exam question is displayed on the right.



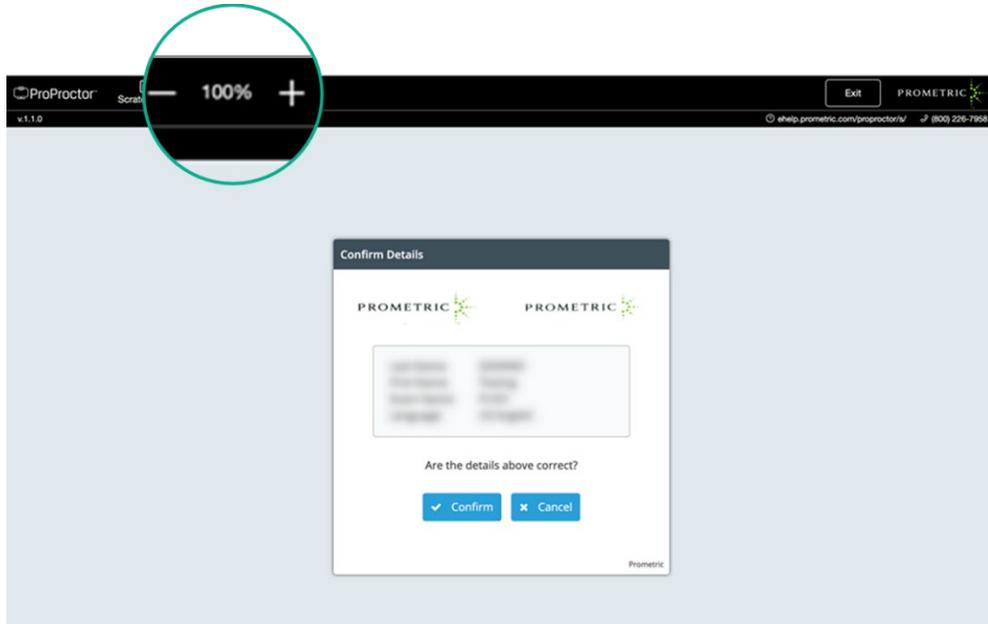
### Below-optimal Viewing on Exam Day | Overlap

If the screen resolution is lower than 1920 x 1080 (i.e. 1400 x 900 or 1366 x 768), the PDF case will overlap and display on top of the options. You are able to drag and move the window or close the PDF. However, this will occur with each question because the display's width and height are below optimal.



## To improve experience on Exam Day | Adjusting Display | 2 steps

If your display is below 1920 x 1080, it is highly recommended to adjust the Display Zoom in the ProProctor App once you have started your exam. The **Display Zoom** is located on the upper left corner:



### Step 1: Adjust Display Zoom to correct overlap

If the PDF case overlaps the questions when the exam begins, adjust the Display Zoom:

**Step 2: Fine tune the PDF zoom**

After adjusting the Display Zoom and docking the content, if the PDF case text becomes blurry or harder to read, increase the PDF zoom to improve readability:
